



Information notice on data management as part of the Ofis Scientific Watch registration

Hcéres processes the data collected when you subscribe to the Ofis Scientific Watch in order to manage subscriptions. The legal basis for this processing is the mission of public interest (GDPR, Art. 6 (1) e)), conferred to Hcéres by the Code de la recherche.

What do we use your data for?

We process your data to manage the distribution of the Ofis Scientific Watch monthly bulletin.

What types of data will be collected and processed?

We process data (last name, first name, institution and e-mail address) from the online registration form. The collection of this information is a condition for being able to send you notification when we publish a bulletin.

How long is your data stored?

Hcéres will keep your e-mail address as long as you have not unsubscribed using the link included in the notification email.

Who will access the data collected?

Within the limits of their respective needs, the following are recipients of all or part of your data: the Ofis and Communication Department staff in charge, the Hcéres digital unit staff (database manager) and the authorised service provider.

What are your rights and how can you exercise these rights?

The processing does not involve automated decision-making.

Hcéres does not conduct any profiling. Hcéres is committed to ensure that the collection and processing of this personal data complies with Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data (General Data Protection Regulation) and with Act No. 78-17 of 6 January 1978 on Data Processing, Data Files and Individual Liberties. No data is transferred outside the European Union.
